MANDURAH FORESHORE FOCUS FORM TOPICS

Members of your Committee attended the City of Mandurah's Foreshore Focus Forum at the Atrium Hotel on Wednesday 18th May 2005 and submitted the following ideas for consideration:

- Breakwater (Tsunami mitigation) which could offer a solution to the sand-bypass problem at the mouth of the Murray and provide the possibility to develop a new Mandurah Ocean Marina – Stage two Western Harbour at the end of Mary Street at Robert Point – with a new commercial fishing port and ancillary businesses; marinas; boardwalk cafes and restaurants; beaches; shops; new deep-water annex yacht club; offices and accommodation buildings right around to the Mary Street boat harbour and launch ramp. This would allow for the expansion or resiting of existing commercial operations at North Harbour to be relocated and the possibility of the North Harbour developing more suitable residential accommodation buildings and a further marina.
- To possibly redevelop (integrate) the Mary Street Boat Harbour; launch ramp and vehicle and trailer parking into a more flexible multi-purpose public boating facility.
- To possibly construct a new 'high' bridge at Mary Street, with a pedestrian and bicycle underpass, to coincide with the first two points, and cutting the centre spans of the existing bridge which could then be used by fishermen and weekend stall holders as a tourist attraction. The need to cut the centre spans is to allow commercial boats, houseboats and fly-bridge boats to have access directly up the channel and not through the Port Mandurah main canal as is the case now.
- To possibly upgrade Henry Sutton Grove with the reinforcement of the seawall plus the enhancement of the beach with possible Venetian steps.
- Depending on the lease conditions applicable to the King Carnival, it is suggested that it be relocated and the whole of Hall Park foreshore and heritage precinct have a total (scenic and cultural) upgrade with a suggested music shell; boardwalk cafes and restaurants to complement the planned improvement of the eastern foreshore development plans under the Mandurah Central Revitalisation Strategy.
- To possibly fully upgrade the small public boat ramp at the end of Leisure Way under the bypass bridge.
- Evaluate the possibility of moving the Waterside public boat ramp out to access the main channel at the end of Waterside Drive beneath the Southern [by-pass] Bridge.
- Provide a long-term management plan that may incorporate the construction of a boardwalk across the bird sanctuary in Soldiers Cove.

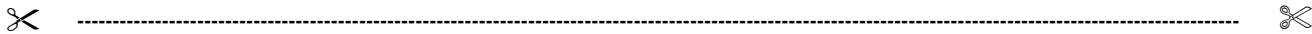
